

## Regulations governing the European Baccalaureate 2014

### Written and oral examinations

#### a) Written examinations

Candidates will take 5 written examinations :

- i. **L1 or L1 Advanced** for pupils who followed the course
- ii. **L2 or L2 Advanced** for pupils who followed the course
- iii. **Mathematics 3 or 5 periods**
- iv. Option (4 periods)
- v. another option (4 periods)

#### b) Oral examinations

Candidates will take **three** oral examinations:

- i. If candidates have followed the advanced course → **L1 Advanced**  
Otherwise → **L1**
- ii. Choice possible between :
  - **L2 or L2 Advanced if taken).**
  - **History 2p**
  - **History 4p**
  - **Géography 2p**
  - **Géography 4p**
- ii. If candidates have followed the advanced course in Mathematics → **Advanced Mathematics**  
Otherwise, choice possible between :
  - **Biology 2p**
  - **Biology 4p**
  - **Physics 4p**
  - **Chemistry 4p**
  - **Philosophy 2p**
  - **Philosophy 4p**
  - **Language 3**
  - **Language 4**

#### c) Constraints:

- Subjects which are taken as the 4th or 5th written examination cannot be taken as orals.
- A complementary course cannot be offered for oral examination in the Baccalaureate.

### 1. Final mark

The Baccalaureate final mark consists of :

- The A1 mark 10%      The A2 mark 10%
- the mark B (Prebac or tests) 30%
- the written examinations 35% (7% per written exam)
- The oral examinations 15% (5% per oral exam)
