

Year 2 and 3. Option choices

Frequently asked questions.

1. If I choose Latin in year 2, must I continue with it in year 3?
Can I continue with it in year 4 or give it up?
You must continue with Latin in Year 3.
You may give up Latin at the end of year 3.
You may continue in year 4/5 if sufficient pupils choose it.
The same applies for Ancient Greek.
2. Does my choice of 4 or 6 lessons of mathematics determine what I must take in year 6/7?
If you choose maths 4, you are strongly advised to choose maths 3 in year 6.
If you choose maths 6, you may choose either course in year 6.
Maths 5 is recommended or essential for the following university courses mathematics, ICT, physical sciences, engineering, economics
3. Which subjects chosen in year 4 must be continued in year 6?
*None of the optional subjects **must** be continued in year 6*
However, you will have to choose some option subjects in year 6 so you may wish to continue with your new subjects. For example, if you enjoy languages, you may well continue language 4 in year 6.
*In year 6, you may continue **only** with L1 and L2. In this case, you would probably have chosen some science options (4 lessons each).*
You can mix science and language options along with humanities in year 6.
4. Can I start economics in year 6 if I do not choose it in year 4?
You may start the 2-lesson course.
The four lesson course is possible but only with the agreement of the school and economics teachers.
5. Can I choose art of Music in year 6 without these subjects in year 4 and 5?
It is recommended that you study these subjects in year 4 and 5 to prepare for year 6 and 7. The teacher may allow you to start the Option course but there is no guarantee of this.
