

Organising students' mobility

Temporarily visiting other schools in a different country gives students the chance to improve their language skills and to mature through experiencing a different educational and cultural environment.

European schools offer the possibility of hosting other students as well as supporting their students to visit other schools. Both can take place as real exchanges (visit and return visit) or as one-way visits. Mobility programmes take place regularly within the 1st semester of S4 and S5.

The deadline to apply for a visit during the 2018-2019 school year is 12th of January 2018.

The process of application

Please present the application (Annexes 2, 5, 7) at the latest on 12th January 2018.

The application will be discussed in the school, all the teachers of the concrete student will be asked for agreement.

The coordinator contacts the host-schools – January-February.
Parents will be informed if the host-school accepted the application.
Parents could start the search for host-family.

All the documents should be ready by the 30th of April 2018 and presented to the home-school and host-school.

Choice of the school

Student should think and write (Annex 7, learning agreement), what are the aims, why it is good to participate in the Students' Mobility Program.

By the choice of the school please visit the home-pages of the European Schools (<https://www.eursc.eu/de/European-Schools/locations>) and/or Accredited European Schools (<https://www.eursc.eu/de/Accredited-European-Schools/locations>) to find out, which language sections are available there and if the student's L1 is taught in school.

Many schools have established their own rules to the students' mobility.

- ▶ some school accept mutual exchange – the families host the students mutually;
- ▶ limited the number of incoming and outgoing students (it should be equal);
- ▶ some schools accept only the whole semester exchanges;
- ▶ some set the limitation considering the level of studies (only for S5 students).

In host-school

In host-school the student will follow the same courses than in the home-school. In some subject despite of the same curriculum some themes and topics could differ (for instance, studied earlier). In this case it is good to keep contact with teachers (classmates) in home-school.
